learn more about how your contributions make a difference. And remember Fr. Romain's words in a recent pastoral message in our bulletin:

*The Lord is sending us, you and me, the Church to feed his children. Recently I had the privilege to meet Magnus MacFarlane-Barrow, founder of Mary's Meals, an international movement that sets up school feeding projects in communities where poverty and hunger prevent children from gaining an education. Mary's Meals is a simple idea that works by providing a daily meal in a place of education, for chronically poor children who are attracted to the classroom where they can gain a basic education that provides an escape route from poverty. Today, Mary's Meals allows over 920,000 children from impoverished areas in Africa, Asia, the Caribbean, Eastern Europe and South America, to go to school and receive meals every school day.*
